Making Harvest My Home 8
Pillar #4: Sharing the goodness of Jesus with boldness
Acts 4:1-33

1. List as many people as you can who shared the good news of Jesus with you. Who was the boldest? What is the boldest thing someone has ever said to you about Jesus? What affect did it have on you?
2. "You become an evangelist of what you worship." Why is this true? How have you seen it in your world this week? If we were to determine what you worship based on what you were trying to convert people to, what would we say you worship? Are you ashamed to talk about the "non-spiritual" things you believe in? Why are we ashamed to talk about the spiritual things we believe in?
3. What is the difference between religion and the gospel? Why do the religious people get so annoyed at the gospel? Why are religious people the hardest to win to Christ? Were you (or are you) a religious person that had to repent of religion to believe the gospel?
4. What is the difference between a "Red Apple" and a "Green Apple" in terms of evangelism? How did God ripen you to the gospel? Who are the "Red Apples" in your life? Who are the "Green Apples?"
5. Do you agree or disagree with this statement? "Preach the gospel. If necessary use words." Why?
6. What good deeds are you doing (or should you be doing) in the name of Jesus that is opening the door for the good news of Jesus? Why is it not enough just to "let your life be a witness?"
7. What would you say to Tiger Woods if he gave you 5 minutes to share your advice about how he can recover? What will happen to him if he doesn't take your advice? Why aren't you sharing your advice with those whom you actually will get to speak?
8. Do you use your lack of communication skill as an excuse not to share the good news? Where does the power come from? Have you "been with Jesus" enough lately that others recognize it?
9. Spend time as a group praying for boldness. Identify at least one person this week you need to share the good news with. Create a plan to do it. Ask the group to keep you accountable for doing it.
