Simply Saved 1 The ABC's of Salvation: Admit Acts 16:22-34

- Outside of a biblical context, can you think of ways that you have been "saved" from some tragedy or rescued from danger. If so, tell about it. What kind of danger were you in? What feelings did you have before you were saved? What feelings did you have afterward?
- 2. List as many synonyms as you can for the term "saved." How many of the synonyms appear in the Bible related to salvation.
- 3. What does God save people from?
- 4. Do you agree or disagree with these two statements. Why or why not?
 - a. Salvation is simple.
 - b. Salvation is easy.
- 5. In Acts 16:30 the jailer asked "What must I do to be saved?" Have you ever asked that question? When was the first time? When was the last time? What prompted the question?
- 6. Do you think it is important to regularly ask the same question to examine if you have done what you need to do to be saved? Why or why not?
- 7. Does the Devil cause us to doubt our salvation? Why is it dangerous to blame every doubt on the Devil?
- 8. Discuss the following points from the message? How did God do to prepare you like the jailer to bring you to the place where you admitted you needed to be saved?
 - 1. You are moved by the praise of a real God. (v. 25)
 - 2. Your foundations are shaken. (v. 26)
 - 3. You are awakened to the reality of your impending death. (v. 27)
 - 4. You realize someone cares about your condition. (v. 28)
 - 5. You admit you are afraid. (v. 29)
 - 6. You must believe in the Lord Jesus. (v. 30-31)
 - 7. You must be willing to go public with your faith. (v. 32-34)
- 9. It is common to hear someone say they accepted Jesus as savior at one point in their life then accepted him as Lord at some later point when God really changed their lives? Why is it impossible to accept Jesus as savior with accepting him as Lord? Why is it a dangerous error to speak of being saved this way? Have you ever believed this? Have you believed in the LORD Jesus or just the SAVIOR Jesus?
