<u>Dig In</u>

- 1. Discouragement is defeated when you embrace the pressure God approves through the power God provides with the perspective God imparts.
- 2. <u>Discouragement</u>: A loss of passion to finish a God-given assignment when conflicting pressures increase.
- 3. Identify the assignments that God has given you. In which of those assignments are experiencing a lesser degree of passion than you had previously?
- 4. Read Joshua 1:9. Discuss this statement: "Disappointment is inevitable. Discouragement is a choice."
- 5. Are you experiencing any of the following? Are you allowing these to lead to discouragement?
 - Unfulfilled vision
 - Unanswered prayer
 - Unsatisfied longings
 - Unrecognized accomplishments
 - Unappreciated sacrifices
 - Unfunded ambitions
 - Under-resourced teams
 - Unrepentant sin. (What some call discouragement, God calls the consequences of sin. If you want the discouragement to end the sin must end.)
- 6. What is the difference between the person who experiences the things on the left but not the things on the right? Which are you experiencing?
 - Afflicted Crushed
 - Perplexed Despair
 - Persecuted Forsaken
 - Struck down Destroyed

- 1. God wants you to die to self so that life of Jesus can flow through you. How does the cross of Christ at work in you defeat discouragement in you?
- 2. Read 2Cor. 4:1. Have you embraced a role in ministering in the church? Have you backed away from ministry because of discouragement?
