

1. *Evangelism is the process (usually prolonged) of guiding an unbeliever in the power of the Holy Spirit in making many, mini-decisions to overcome obstacles in trusting Christ with their life (present and eternal).* How does this definition change your perspective of evangelism?
2. Do you pray for open doors to share the gospel? What do those prayers sound like?
3. According to Col. 4:2, our prayers should be steadfast, watchful, and thankful. Do you pray these kinds of prayers?
4. Some churches are so focused on getting the gospel out that they fail to get the gospel right. Other churches are so focused on getting the gospel right that they failed to get the gospel out. What is the tendency at your church? How do you correct it?
5. We pray, "God, open the doors." God says, "You, open your mouth." Do you have a proper balance of both? Which do you need to do more often?
6. Do you have confidence that you could make the gospel clear to an unbeliever in a 15-minute presentation? What elements would you include? What scriptures would you use? How would you call for a response?
7. Read Rev. 21:8, Matt. 25:46, 2Thess. 1:9, Luke 16:19-31, John 3:18. Do you really believe those who do not repent and believe will suffer eternally in hell? How does this affect your urgency to share the gospel?
8. Read Rom. 13:11-13. Has your "walk" been an open door or a closed door for outsiders to become Christians?
9. What are you doing to make others thirsty for Jesus? How much time are you spending with outsiders? How can you be intentional about engaging others in conversations about the gospel?
