

1. Where did you get your ideas about what Heaven is like? Did you realize that you had formed ideas about Heaven that were not based on God's Word when you heard the message?
2. Read Ecclesiastes 3:11. How much do you think of eternity? Why do people instinctively know there is life after death?
3. Do you think Osama Bin Laden is in Heaven or Hell? How does the Bible inform your opinion?
4. Read Gen. 1:31 and Romans 8:20-28. Why is there so much trouble in this world? Are you homesick for Heaven? How does the hope of Heaven to bring comfort when the pain of this life is the greatest?
5. Do you often think about your mortality? Read Psalm 90:12. If you were to live to age 80, how many days do you have left? Do the math. How does thinking about your death change your life?
6. Do you understand that you and every person you know will spend eternity in one of two places – Heaven or Hell? How do the choices you make in this life have influence on the world to come? What are you doing to influence people toward Heaven?
7. Read 1 Peter 2:11. Do you remind yourself that this world is not your home and everything in it will burn away, leaving only what is eternal?
8. Discuss this statement: *"Sin is quenching a God-given thirst in a God forbidden way."* How have you done this?
9. Discuss this statement: *"In Heaven God receives unhindered worship from us while we receive unhindered joy from God."* What hinders your joy and God's worship in you now?
10. There will be nothing unclean in Heaven? Are you clean?
11. For every one American who believes he's going to Hell, there are 120 who believe they are going to Heaven. How does this contradict what Jesus said in Matthew 7:13-14?
