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1. Why do you think those who make under \$20,000/yr. are twice as generous as those who make \$100,000/yr? Were you more generous when you had less to give? Why? What causes us to think we can't afford to give?
 2. Generosity is the antidote of materialism. The level of anxiety you sense over giving may be an indication of your level of materialism. How much do you think materialism has a grip on you? How can generosity root this out of your life?
 3. Poverty is not the antidote to materialism. We have wrongly attached a spiritual value to poverty. Read Proverbs 30:8. How can poverty be as dangerous to your spiritual life as riches? Have you thought that poverty was more righteous than being rich?
 4. Read Deut. 8:17-18. Who is responsible for your wealth? What power has God given you to create wealth? Are you using it for his glory? How?
 5. Read Proverbs 19:17. How do you lend to the Lord? What does God promise to a generous man?
 6. Read Proverbs 3:27-28. Do you know someone who is due some good? Who? Do you have it in your power to give to their need? What should you do?
 7. Read Proverbs 11:24. Do you believe the promise offered in this verse? How have you seen it in the lives of others? How have you seen it in your life?
 8. Read Proverbs 22:28. Do you believe the promise offered in this verse? How have you seen it in the lives of others? How have you seen it in your life?
 9. Review the Cycle of Generosity
 - Provision - Has God given me more than I need?
 - Trust - Do I believe "God is Able?"
 - Willingness - Has God given me a desire to give?
 - Decision – Have you made up your mind what you want to give?
 - Delivery - Has the transfer been made from your account to the recipient?
 - Harvest – Have you thanked God for the fruit you see?
 10. God's inexpressible gift to me results in a lifetime of expressible gifts to Him. How are you expressing your love for God through giving?
